Course Description:

This course deals with the main concepts and application of financial accounting. The content covers a broad range of topics in the income and asset value measurement, financial reporting, liabilities and equity, cash flows, ethical behaviour and so on. Students will learn how to prepare a balance sheet, income statement, analyze financial reporting, and calculate and interpret critical ratios. After studying the course, students will be able to understand the accounting process and to develop skills necessary to evaluate an enterprise's financial position and its operating, investing and financing Activities.
