

Course Title: ENG 308 Introduction to Linguistics

Mode of Instruction: Online

Course Description:

This course introduces basic concepts of descriptive linguistics, including phonetics, phonology, morphology, syntax, semantics, and pragmatics, language acquisition, and language processing. Given that language is intimately connected to our cognitive, psychological, and social experience, an understanding of linguistic structure can help illuminate aspects of these domains. This course should give students a new perspective on language and new sense of respect for the species that can manipulate it easily.

- A. Have exposure to a wide array of linguistic diversity as well as systematic patterns and cross-linguistic universals that constrain this diversity;
- B. Form hypotheses about the human language faculty and use linguistic data to test these hypotheses;
- C. Use linguistic resources, extract relevant information from them, and cite them following field-specific conventions;
- D. Examine attitudes towards language and how it is used in society and culture;
- E. Analyze how language varies across speakers, over time, and across dialectal regions.

Description of the Evaluation tasks:
