

Course Title: JPN 101 First Year Japanese

Course Description:

This course provides students with fundamental introduction to Japanese. Instruction of this course aims at the accumulation of basic kana and kanji, common-used sentences and grammar, as well as the understanding of Japanese culture. Elementary ability of listening, speaking, reading and writing will be cultivated after the course. Students are expected to facilitate keen interests in Japanese and prepare well for studying higher level of Japanese language.

Description of the Evaluation tasks:

Assignment/ Essay/...: During the term, students will be required to finish several evaluation tasks within due date. All the tasks are linked with specific course topics/outcomes and will adequately assess students' competence and learning outcomes. Students are encouraged to meet with instructor about these tasks at any point.

Mid-term/ Final Exams/ Quiz/...: There may be periodic quizzes given at the beginning of lecture sessions; the feedback from these quizzes will monitor the progress of the learners and help to set learning priorities. There will be mid-term exam/ final exam for the course. They are the basic criteria for the evaluation of students' learning outcomes and final grade.

Students are supposed to finish each online lecture. Prior to each class, students should finish the required readings. During the class time, students are encouraged to make use of all relevant online course resources and communicate with the instructor. Students' grades are accumulated based on the cumulative evaluations.
