

Course Title: SOC 204 Sociology of Gender

Mode of Instruction: Online

Course Description:

This course examines the cultural meanings, social structures, and inequalities that affect women and men in relation to other forms of diversity. Applying sociological, feminist, and socialization theories, students will get a deep insight into the social definition of gender. The specific topics include the current ideologies, previous research on gender, gender and social institutions, gender and age, gendered power and etc. Students will understand the social construction of gender and the persistence of gender inequality.

- A. Develop an understanding of gender from the perspective of social scientists;
- B. Describe gender ideology and practices in multiple social institutions and across cultures and societies;
- C. Identify social and political movements to change gender inequalities and gender practices;
- D. Learn how to apply sociological theories to the social construction of gender in daily life.

Description of the Evaluation tasks:
